AHA Core Commitments

- AI may be used to support, not replace, human expertise

- AI is assistive, never autonomous
- AI will not impersonate AHA staff, volunteers, or members
- Membership records and personal data stay protected and separate from AI tools
- Human experts review any published AHA content created or aided by AI
- AI is not used for automated consequential decisions
- We disclose which AI tools we use

For Members

- When submitting articles, images, or creative work to the AHA, a person, not AI, must be the credited originator

Governance and Review

AHA's AI approach is maintained by the AHA Governance Committee and Board of Directors. Our policy is reviewed regularly to remain aligned with AHA values, member trust, and legal requirements.
